Once upon a time, a hundred cherry trees were presented by the local government to a certain village. The village leader saw the gift and said, "Oh, what a lot of bother! Does anyone want to plant these cherry trees?" A village group volunteered to plant them on an empty land. However, the trees were not given any care after planting, so that several years later, only eight of the hundred trees remained. What a waste of a good gift!

(1) This story shows two Japanese words that both begin with M and it is surprising that they are connected. The first is "mendokusai," and it could be translated as "What a bother," " [2 ," or "I don't feel like doing this." The second word is "mottainai." In this case it means I " or "It was no good." This is the feeling we get when we "【 3 find something good is thrown away. So, in our story, the leader said "mendokusai" and as a result, 4 I. This happens a lot in life. As soon as we think a life event is too much trouble, we will lose interest and cannot see its potential*. In the case of the cherry trees, although other villages spent time and effort to plant the trees and take care of them, this village ended up with a piece of land with a few short trees. All because one person in the village thought it would be too much trouble.

This is a true story that happened in our village. Actually, the gift trees were not the lovely Somei Yoshino known in famous photos of Japan, but another variety (may be Formosan cherry*). Perhaps someone in the local government also thought it would be too much trouble to get the "popular" type of tree, so they chose the "less" type. This influenced the leader's feelings of (A).

I don't like the word "(B)" because, as in this story, it very often

leads to "(C)"—something being wasted. We need to be very careful of seeing anything in our lives as "too much trouble." How do we know, until we do it, what the result will be? The act of taking trouble can produce a good result.

Take a lesson from the cherry trees. Even though they were the wrong variety, the remaining eight trees bloom to the best of their ability. (5) They don't think "It's too much trouble." So live a happy and positive life, don't think of things as bad, and your life will never be wasted.

There are two things that Mrs. Roy Hodge doesn't like about her new job: if she's not careful, she gets her clothes dirty*; and sometimes, when she's twenty-five hundred miles away from home in a huge truck, she wishes to stop to visit a beauty shop.

But (1)<u>Mrs. Hodge is a happy worker</u>. When her husband walks out of their home in Arkansas*, and starts out for California, she doesn't have to say goodbye. She climbs up in the seat beside him and they go off together.

In this way, hundreds of wives of long-distance truck drivers team up with their husbands these days. Like the Hodges, the couples share the driving, receive two salaries*, and most long-distance truck drivers and their wives don't have to feel lonely.

No one knows exactly how many of these husband-and-wife teams there are, but at certain big truck stops, eighty to a hundred of them are seen a week, and (2)the number is growing.

"We think it works out fine," says the president of a deliver* service company. Seven years ago, he did not have any man-and-wife teams. Now fifty of them are working on his company's 650 trucks.

"People often ask me whether women can drive trucks," he says. "Most of our women drivers are just as good as men, and some are better. These new trucks aren't so hard to drive. Most of our women drivers are between thirty-eight and fifty-eight years old. Their children are grown up or in college, so they can get away from home easily."

Mr. and Mrs. Hodge were married a year ago, and have no children. Their truck was packed with more than thirty thousand pounds of refrigerated* chicken parts; they were taking them from Alabama to California. [B]

(3)"I won't team up with any man," Mr. Hodge said, while his wife fixed her hair in front of the huge side-view mirror of their truck. "Driving with another man is like being married to him. If you don't get along well, it can be terrible; you're locked up together in that seat, and you can really get to hate one another. Bringing my wife along is the smartest thing I have ever done. It's really a wonderful life for a husband and wife." [C]

His wife said: "Usually I drive five hours and he drives five. I drive on the big highways* because it's easier. He drives in the towns and does the parking. [D]

Their truck with an air-conditioner has a bed behind the driver's seat. One can sleep in the bed while the other drives. Some trucks even have a television set that the off-duty* driver can watch as the truck drives along the road, but the Hodges' only entertainment is a radio.

The Hodges are pleased with their work. (4)"The two of us make good money and enjoy the relationship," Mr. Hodge said.
